Easter! The Passover of Jesus and my own.



Dear brothers and sisters,

Christ has been sacrificed as our Passover. So says the Easter Liturgy. The Passover of the Israelites out of the slavery in Egypt into the freedom of the Promised Land was foreshadowing and promise. In Jesus we have the reality that was in preparation. In Jesus (the real Moses), we have been led out of the slavery of sin, crushed the devil's reign (Pharaoh), saved by the Lamb of God for eternal life, made righteous by faith through baptism (Red Sea), and received a new and abundant covenant: Gods Kingdom. United to Jesus, now risen and still with us, we have died to sin and live the new life in the Holy Spirit with our words and deeds. The sharing of His Spirit is the fullness of Jesus Easter gift. All is done to the glory of the Father. All is the free gift of God Who loves us that much.

The challenge for us is to say "Yes" to this gift from moment to moment so that the Spirit can transform us in the likeness of Jesus to become fully son or daughter of the Father through Jesus in the Holy Spirit. Our Easter this year renews these gifts in our Liturgical Celebration, May the fullness of Easter Joy embrace us: Christ is truly Risen!

A lot of us have a deeper sadness and confusion: I fail all the time in charity and many other things how can I ever be "perfect as the Father is perfect" as Jesus tells us? Jesus says: through repentance I will forgive, that is my Easter gift. Can repentance make perfect, can it be Joy? There are two kinds of repentance. There is a shallow one, not from the heart, which is more concerned to avoid punishment and kind of makes a trade off with God. This not prevents from falling deeper into sin and keeps a person mediocre at best. Being afraid of a just God and the possibility of hell are always in the back of his mind. Then there is true repentance or compunction when I am moved by Gods awful and infinite love and the challenge to respond to that love and the gift of Himself to me. This repentance brings me in the Heart of Jesus and an intimate relationship with Him. Through the gift of the Holy Spirit I acquire a "fear of the Lord" that is reverence and wanting to live for Gods glory.

Penance creates the space for the Sprit to move in and start to transform me. But you say: I am still very imperfect sinning moment after moment and becoming more aware of it as I start to know Gods Love and perfection and that makes me sad and unsure. It is here that I have to learn a very important lesson from St.Paul who says; "My strength was made perfect in weakness." We are weak in selfishness and distrust, etc in any given moment and therefore never reach that full perfection on earth. But from moment to moment we repent and live in trust of God's continuous mercy and forgiveness, growing in the Spirit, united with Christ's Passion. Deeper penance, deeper love, closer to God's Holiness. We grow motivated by trust. What matters is not so much our weakness, but how quickly we realize our failings and run back to the embrace of His Sacred Heart.

This constant reuniting experiencing His ever loving and forgiving presence, being able to love more in spite of our weaknesses is the joy of continual penance: Easter joy, every day. For us Catholics penance includes a regular reception of the Sacrament of Penance, sacrament also of forgiveness and peace, confessing that we are sinners and giving thanks and praise to God.

A very Happy and blessed Easter to every one of you and thank you so much for the special tribute on my 50th Anniversary to Priesthood on March 18th. It touched my heart. Also Magnificat was represented at the mass and reception at St.Elizabeth Seton Parish. Many thanks, keep me in your prayers as I do with you all.

Holy Week will testify to the anointing of Magnificat. The Magnificat family should find cause to celebrate. May we all have this prayer in our heart.

"Lord, open my eyes to see the many ways in which you are pouring out your love in our midst. And may we shout: My soul proclaims the goodness of the Lord."


NORTH ZONE PRAYER GROUP SEMINAR ON DISCERNING – MARCH 4, 2006
