Dear Friends,

Sis. Diana Henderson (faithful copy hunter) told me there are two pages for me to fill. You know I like to talk about spirituality and prayer and I always hope that I am not talking over your heads or past your ears.

Prayer is communication with God. First, it is listening to His Word and then responding to it with our word and our life. God's Word is Jesus, embodied in flesh and blood, revealed and spoken to us through the preaching and liturgy of the Church, one with Gods word in Scripture. Jesus said on the night before He died; "Make your home in me as I make My home in you" (John 15,4). That is "THE" invitation. Home means total personal intimacy of love, trust and communion with Jesus and through Him being drawn into the Blessed Trinity.

I am aware in my own life how much I am still inclined to treat God as a stranger. Keeping Him on a distance through doubts and fears and having the illusions of my own course of happiness. But I am on the journey, home bound by God's grace. The first gift I have to ask (keep asking) of the Holy Spirit is *Knowledge*: to know God as my loving Father, total Love and Mercy, ready to receive me as I am, with all my past mistakes and sins. Then, I can start to enter into a deeper meeting with God and experience more of what St. Paul calls "the height and the depth, the length and the breadth of God's love that surpasses all understanding".

The Desert Fathers

For the Christian, the Bible is the first and foremost book of prayer. The only one the early Christians knew. They learned long passages by heart since they did not have any printed words. They were not interested in how much they read but how deeply they could absorb it in their hearts and lives. They would read a few verses at a time, going over them again and again, penetrating their inner meaning. Then they would pause in moments of deep interior stillness to allow the Holy Spirit to inspire them and enable the impact of the words to seep into the very marrow of their being. It is this prayer of silence or done "in secret" that Jesus talks about as the most effective prayer through which Jesus begins to make His home within us.

Lectio Divina - The Four Rs

We can follow the example of the Desert Fathers by using four steps.

- 1. Reading in Latin: Lectio
 - Begin by reading the sacred texts. Then re-read them slowly again till they are absorbed.
- 2. Reflection in Latin: Meditation
 - Reflect on what you read. Mull it around in your mind. Get into the characters and allow the inner meaning to seep into the very marrow of your being.
- 3. Reaction in Latin: Oratio (prayer)
 - React in your own way, from the heart and raise it to express praise, thanksgiving, petition and repentance.
- 4. Resting in Latin: Contemplation
 - Rest in deep interior stillness. Let God take over with deep sharing and healing. Distractions come to disturb this contemplative stillness which makes contemplation initially very difficult.

For centuries, it was thought that contemplative prayer was only for the cloistered monks and nuns who dedicated their life to it. The trappist monk writer Thomas Nerton, among others, began to show that it is the prayer for all Christians. With some guidance and regular practice, that what seems so difficult, can become easier for each one of us and the few moments of inner stillness that we muster in the beginning become longer. In contemplative prayer, our hearts and minds are raised and open to God's action of uniting us with Him, healing us even into the subconscious and enabling our weak human loving to come to a degree and a way impossible without it.

Dear friends, I am deeply convinced of Jesus' invitation to pray "in secret" and the unbelievable benefit of it. I am willing to practice it with you from time to time, maybe as part of the Saturday prayer meeting. There is good reading material about it available, but in the end, only practice can make us understand and enjoy. Pray for me, a sinner.

Dear Magnificat Family,

Some 15 years ago, Magnificat encountered its first serious trial regarding the choice of leaders. I remember it coincided with our pilgrimage to Lourdes. I made with Mommy Donna the long Way of the Cross there for the intention of Magnificat. Now we face another test. I am going on pilgrimage to Lourdes once more. I am sure Mommy Donna will join me in spirit as I make the Long Way of the Cross for Magnificat. Our family has a special place in her heart. Where she is, she prays for us still.

Fr. Matt coined an expression which turns out to be prophecy, "the closing of a period." Indeed for all our apprehensions for what came to pass will be just a closing not an end.

The official reason given in the letter to me by the Archdiocese for the withdrawal of my faculty to exercise my priestly ministry in the Archdiocese of Toronto is "to promote the integrated pastoral care of the faithful in the Archdiocese of Toronto." I understand this to mean that I do not belong to the clergy of the Archdiocese and therefore, I am not in the position to promote their program. Perhaps we failed to make the official coordination with the new administration of the Archdiocese at the outset. Whatever the failure on our part, let us see what came to pass as *God's hands leading us to a direction*. Magnificat must work doubly harder now to prove to the ecclesiastical authority that the community is an asset to the Archdiocese. I will still be of help within the parameters of the directive. *In time, God willing, "the closing of the period" will be "the opening of the door."*

The eyes of our ecclesiastical superiors are on Magnificat now. Let us show them the mettle of our anointing. Let us take heart from the Easter event. There is no tomb which holds the risen Lord. Let us go and tell our people: He is risen. Only our lack of faith and hope and trust in Jesus, King of Mercy will cause us to fail to build this place we dedicated to our mother, Mary Queen of the World, to be the Shrine of Jesus, King of Mercy.

Gathering you all in my heart and praying for my dear Magnificat family.




