#### ADVENT - CHRISTMAS MESSAGE

Dear Friends,

For me, it is Christmas, when I hear at midnight Mass, the announcement of the Angel to the shepherds: "Good News of great joy for all the people: to you is born this day in the City of David, a Saviour, Who is Christ, The Lord".

We are overjoyed and thankful for the Child that is given to us. The Advent liturgies have made us ready for a renewed and deeper appreciation. We listened there to the promises of God made to the prophets: paradise restored, everlasting happiness, people divinized, mortals made immortal, sinners justified, the poor raising to glory. Each promise made in the first reading is shown in the gospel as fulfilled in Jesus, the Good Shepherd. God not only made an official covenant to win our belief, but He also sent a Mediator to establish it. Not an angel, not a prince, but His eternally begotten Son. He took our nature so that He could stand in for each one of us and we could have a new birth, become a new creation in Him.

*Christmas is about the birth of Jesus but also about our birth as sons and daughters of God.* In the Incarnation, God, the Blessed Trinity, has revealed the very depth of the Father's being. He is not only power and majesty but, yes, my friends, God is Childhood and Tenderness, because He is Father. He has shown the extent of being a Father by showing us His Son.

In every word and action of His life, Jesus showed God's tender love. He asks us to join Him in showing that same love to his Father and to each other. Two thousand years have passed since Christ was born and gave His life. How are people reacting to God's invitation and gifts?

People have forgotten. People have no use for it. People don't understand it. People don't see it. They keep imagining that greatness and happiness lies in dominion, earthly goods and power.

Poor us, the only time we feel truly great and happy is when we are filled with true love, when we are like the Father, when we follow the Son Who is the Way, when we receive the Holy Spirit Who is the gift of God's Love. We can share in the family life of God, now and forever. What a conversion has to take place in us through ongoing repentance, because our false self, which tells us to dominate keeps re-awakening in us and finds always new ways to trick us.

But what a joy we can experience in faith: we can stop fearing. *Jesus is our Saviour*. We are never alone any longer, never abandoned in our faults, in our shame and despair. This is the reality of God's Kingdom brought by Jesus and is now among us. God Has fulfilled His promises. Christ will come once more to reward the just, deserving His mercy and to separate those deserving His anger.

Our whole life then becomes Advent; waiting, expecting, preparing. This is being Church: getting together in the Spirit of Jesus, sowing the seeds of unity and caring in the midst of conflict and strife. We look at people with the eyes of Jesus and find behind all the facades of anger, crime and addiction, the person who really wants to be recognized and loved.

In this Advent in this year and in the Advent that lasts, all our life we want to be servants of God's Kingdom to make the Good News of Christ known to those whom God puts on our path, sharing as good as we can, the comfort and support that come from the Lord Who took human flesh and Who lives in us.

I will offer my Christmas midnight mass for all of you. (It will be at 10.00 p.m. Christmas Eve at the Monastery of the Carmelite Sisters in Zephyr).

John Paul II, in his Angelus message of December 19, 1999, explained that Christmas is not simply the remembrance of an event that took place 2000 years ago when, according to the Gospel, the power of God took on the frailty of a baby. It is really about a living reality that is repeated every year in the hearts of believers.

"The mystery of the Holy Night, which historically happened two thousand years ago, must be lived as a spiritual event in the 'today' of the Liturgy," the Pope clarified. "The Word who found a dwelling in Mary's womb comes to knock on the heart of every person with singular intensity at Christmas."

The gift of the Saviour is an expression of good-will or love to men, and therefore God is to be praised. God's work of redemption is consistently represented in scripture as the fruit of the love of God. No words can adequately express the greatness of that love. His love is beyond our full comprehension. Yet how little does man feel it! And how many of us turn away from the highest love of God, and treat the expression of that love without appreciation! Surely, if God so loved us first, we must also love Him back.

How can we respond when Jesus knocks and asks us to open our hearts to Him? How can we return this great love which surpasses all understanding? We let Him enter our homes, our cities, our nations, everywhere on earth! We give of ourselves in friendship and sincere affection, fraternal help and forgiveness, in shared time and reciprocal listening. We open our hearts to people around us, to the stranger on the street needing something warm to eat or drink, to the friend or relative who seeking company because he is lonely, extending a hand even to those who have nothing but hostility and disdain for us. In all of them, there we will find Jesus. The love that we extend to them is a love we return to Jesus. As He stretches out His hand to us in the spirit of peace, let us take that hand which seeks to take nothing from us, but only to give.

This is the invitation of Jesus, not only during this holy season of Christmas. Christmas is a living reality which we live every day. After all, the whole of our lives is a hopeful and vigilant awaiting of the final coming of Christ.

May the season of Christmas awaken in our hearts memories of God's love and goodness so that we can discern the star of hope. *A Blessed Christmas to one and all!*

#### The Life Of Poverty Which Jesus Led From His Birth.

#### Thought:

God so ordained that, at the time when His Son was to be born on this earth, the Roman emperor should issue a decree ordering everyone to go to the place of his origin and there be registered in the census. Thus it came about that, in obedience to this decree, Joseph went to Bethlehem together with his virgin wife when she was soon to have her Child. Finding no lodging either in the poor inn or in the other houses of the town, they were forced to spend the night in a cave that was used as a stable for animals, and it was here that Mary gave birth to the King of heaven. If Jesus had been born in Nazareth, He would also, it is true, have been born in poverty; but there He would at least have had a dry room, a little fire, warm clothes and a more comfortable cradle. Yet He chose to be born in this cold, damp cave, and to have a manger for a cradle, with prickly straw for a mattress, in order that He might suffer for us.

Let us enter in spirit into this cave of Bethlehem, but let us enter in a spirit of lively faith. If we go there without faith, we shall see nothing but a poor infant, and the sight of this lovely child shivering and crying on his rough bed of straw may indeed move us to pity. But if we enter with faith and consider that this Babe is the very Son, God, who for love of us has come down on earth and suffers so much to pay the penalty for our sins, how can we help thanking and loving Him in return?

#### Prayer:

O Dear Infant Jesus, how could I be so ungrateful and offend You so often, if I realized how much You have suffered for me? But these tears which You shed, this poverty which You embraced for love of me, make me hope for the pardon of all the offenses I have committed against You.

My Jesus, I am sorry for having so often turned my back on You. But now I love You above all else. "My God and my all!"

From now on You, O my God, shall be my only treasure and my only good. With Saint Ignatius of Loyola I will say to Thee, "Give me the grace to love You; that is enough for me." I long for nothing else; I want nothing else. You alone art enough for me, my Jesus, my life, my love.

O Mary, my Mother, obtain for me the grace that I may always love Jesus and always be loved by Him. Amen.
